





Council meetings are scheduled for October 6 at 9 am and October 20, 2020 at 7 pm in the Howick Council chambers at the municipal office. Agendas are posted on Howick’s website on the Friday preceding the meeting. All meetings of Council are open to the public. Please note Howick’s new municipal office hours, Fridays from 8 am – 4 pm

**Highlights from the September 2020 Howick Council meetings:**

- Council deemed the 1994 Fire Rescue Truck as a surplus asset and direct staff to dispose
- Council directed staff to install ice at the Howick Community Centre for the 2020/2021 season
- Council approved amending Howick municipal office hours on Fridays from 8 am – 4 pm
- Council extended the Service Agreement of Howick Township Drainage Superintendent Wray Wilson until September 30, 2021
- Council approved amendments to Howick Township By-law Enforcement Fees and Charges; \$100 re-inspection where the property owner fails to comply and 25% administration fee
- Council approved to delegate authority to provide civil marriage solemnization services to Marilyn Ashley

By-laws are put in place to protect the health and safety of the general public. Howick’s By-law Enforcement Officer Nicole Mullin will initiate an inspection after receiving a written complaint regarding property standards and/or municipal by-law violations. Please submit completed complaint forms to the municipal office or email it to [bylaw@howick.ca](mailto:bylaw@howick.ca). Complaint forms are available at the municipal office, By-law Enforcement Officer or online at [www.howick.ca](http://www.howick.ca). Please note new fees for re-inspection where the property owner fails to comply. After a complaint is submitted, the By-law Enforcement Officer conducts an inspection of the property. Once a contravention of a by-law is found, the By-law Enforcement Officer will notify the property owner and indicate a specific date that the property must come into compliance. A re-inspection will take place on the date indicated; if there is compliance, no charge will be applied. If there is no compliance, a \$100.00 fee will be applied for a re-inspection.

**Community Safety and Well Being Plan**

The Province has mandated municipalities prepare and adopt a Community Safety and Well-Being plan, working with police services, health/mental health, education, community/social services and children/youth services as they undertake the planning process. The goal of this plan, in collaboration with community partners and residents, is to enhance our collective ability to respond to issues and build on the many successful efforts that contribute to a strong sense of safety and well-being in our community. 

# HOWICK CENTRAL SCHOOL



As I write this, today was our first day back at Howick Central Public School with students. This September's school opening is one for the books and is certainly like nothing else our staff, families and students have ever seen before. Our staff have worked tirelessly over the last few months preparing our students for their new normal given the guidelines that the Ministry of Education and Huron Perth Health Unit have provided us with. We are optimistic that this will be a case of for now and not forever.

Our goal, in September, as a school staff is to focus on relationships and establishing our new normal. We are so happy to have our students back and we are taking the time to remind them of proper handwashing, mask wearing and physical distancing as much as possible so we can all remain safe at Howick. Students remain with their cohort, which is their homeroom, for the entire day. In years past, the students would travel to the music teacher or to the French teacher's classroom but this year the teacher goes to them to reduce the amount of traffic in the hallways. Additionally, students remain in the same group during recess and lunch and we have reduced the number of classes on the yard at recess to promote physical distancing.

This year, our enrollment is down from last year and we have about two hundred and eighty nine students enrolled at Howick. Additionally, we have thirty students at Howick who have opted for online learning. These students work with teachers from outside of Howick on an online platform. We miss these students and hope they do well in their new virtual school and we look forward to the day when they can return. We have fourteen homerooms this year with the largest class at around 23 students. Currently, we have about thirty two staff members at Howick. Many of our staff members returned and in addition to them, we welcome Mrs. Tabitha McDougall who is from the Wingham area, Mrs. Nicole Vincent who worked at Howick a few years ago and is also from the North Huron area. Ms. Whitelock is the DECE who is covering for Mrs. Thebeau's maternity leave. Madame George, from the Listowel area, was recently married this summer and is our new French teacher. We also welcome two familiar faces back to Howick: Ms. Dayna Lambier has returned to Howick from the Ed Centre and will be working as an educational assistant, and Mrs. Tina Pruden, technical resource assistant, who is back in the building to work with students to help them with their technology needs on Tuesdays and Thursdays. Ms. Elizabeth Hooper, who runs the YMCA before and after school program, also works as an educational assistant during the school day.

As many of you have likely seen in the news, school boards and bus companies around the province are in need of qualified staff. If you know of someone who would be interested in driving a school bus, supply teaching, working as a supply educational assistant or a custodian, please reach out to us at the school and we will connect you to the human resources department at the Education Centre.

This school year will look different as it begins and we look forward to connecting with our community in different ways. As the year progresses we hope to update you and keep you connected. ## Ontario supports hospital upgrades and repairs

HURON-BRUCE — The Ontario government is providing more than \$3.8 million to hospitals in Huron-Bruce to address critical upgrades, repairs and maintenance.

Huron-Bruce MPP Lisa Thompson said that the Health Infrastructure Renewal Fund will help hospitals maintain their infrastructure and ensure a safe and comfortable environment for patients to receive care.

“Every year these funds play a vital role in making sure our hospitals are kept up to date and safe,” Thompson said. “With today’s challenging times, this money is especially important.”

Hospitals receiving money include:

South Bruce Grey Health Centre - \$2,165,017 (including hospitals in Kincardine, Walkerton, Chesley, and Durham)

South Huron Hospital - \$446,012

Wingham and District Hospital - \$497,793

Seaforth Community Hospital - \$365,478

Alexandra Marine and General Hospital - \$146,332

Clinton Public Hospital - \$223,880

“Maintaining hospital infrastructure is another example of how our government is ensuring that Ontarians have access to health care services they can depend on, especially during these unprecedented times,” said Christine Elliott, Deputy

Premier and Minister of Health. “Our ongoing investments to support essential projects like repairing roofs and windows and adding more isolation spaces can make a big difference to a patient's experience. It’s part of our plan to build the capacity we need to end hallway health care in Ontario.”

Projects will also support the hospitals in their ongoing response to COVID-19, such as updating HVAC systems to enhance patient and staff safety, creating additional isolation space and negative air pressure flow rooms to increase capacity and enhancing infection prevention and control measures.

**Howick Library will be open Saturdays from 11:00-2:00pm for curbside appointments.**





## “Serve Up Fire Safety in the Kitchen!”™



October 4-10 2020 – The Howick Fire Department is teaming up with the National Fire Protection Association® (NFPA®) — the official sponsor of Fire Prevention Week for more than 90 years —to promote this year’s Fire Prevention Week campaign, “Serve Up Fire Safety in the Kitchen!” The campaign works to educate everyone about simple but important actions they can take to keep themselves and those around them safe.

According to NFPA, cooking is the leading cause of home fires and home fire injuries in Canada. Almost half (44%) of reported home fires started in the kitchen. Two-thirds (66%) of home cooking fires start with the ignition of food or other cooking materials.

The Howick Fire Department encourages all residents to embrace the 2020 Fire Prevention Week theme.

“The most important step you should take before making a meal is to “Serve Up Fire Safety in the Kitchen!” said Fire Chief Shawn Edwards. “A cooking fire can grow quickly. I have seen many homes damaged and people injured by fires that could easily have been prevented.”


Howick Fire wants to share safety tips to keep you from having a cooking fire.

- Never leave cooking food unattended. Stay in the kitchen while you are frying, grilling or broiling. If you have to leave, even for a short time, turn off the stove.
- If you are simmering, baking, roasting, or boiling food,


check it regularly, remain in the home while food is cooking, and use a timer to remind you that you’re cooking.

- You have to be alert when cooking. You won’t be alert if you are sleepy, have taken medicine or drugs, or consumed alcohol that makes you drowsy.
- Always keep an oven mitt and pan lid nearby when you’re cooking. If a small grease fire starts, slide the lid over the pan to smother the flame. Turn off the burner, and leave the pan covered until it is completely cool.
- Have a “kid-free zone” of at least 3 feet around the stove and areas where hot food or drink is prepared or carried.

## Harvest Pumpkin Pie

Prep: 20 mins  
Cook: 1 hr  
Yields: 6 to 8 Servings



#### Ingredients

- 1 9 inch premade pie crust
- 2 eggs
- 1 1/2 cups cooked pumpkin puree
- 3/4 cup light cream
- 1 tsp cinnamon
- 1/2 tsp cloves
- 1/2 tsp ginger
- 1/2 tsp nutmeg
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 2 tbsp sour cream
- 1 1/2 tsp milk

#### Directions

- 1 Roll out the pastry and fit into a 9 inch pie plate. Trim, leaving 1 inch to overhang; fold under and flute the edges. Set aside.
- 2 In a large bowl, beat the eggs lightly.
- 3 Blend in the pumpkin, sugar, light cream, cinnamon, cloves, ginger, nutmeg and salt. Pour the mixture into the pastry shell.
- 4 Combine the sour cream with the milk, and drizzle in a spiral pattern over the filling.
- 5 Beginning at the centre, pull the tip of a knife shallowly through the filling and sour cream mixture at 8 evenly spaced intervals.
- 6 Beginning at the outside, pull the knife through the middle of the intervals toward the centre to create a web pattern.
- 7 Bake on the lowest rack at 350°F for about 1 hour. or until the filling is set.
